building, went to the Doctor in charge and said this lady claimed a very valuable necklave was missing. The Doctor asked me about it and I remembered about her refusal to remove the beads. The inspector fumed and fussed as she could not be deported until necklace was found or paid for as she said they were worth \$400. this was a serious matter. We examined everything several times and went through the ward with a fine-tooth comb. No necklace and the Doctor did not know what to do. I went to the nurses and asked them to help me search once again. everything was rooted out. beds searched again, and finally as were about to give up. I dugdown into a radiator hole, saw something red and dusty and dragged up these wonderful beads—I took them to the office. Doctor wondered how they could of got down there. I told him woman must have thought she would be allowed to stay or at least get paid a nice sum. The Doctor called the inspector and gave him H---.

One day a representative of a race came to me and said" Miss Daly you are nice lady and I dont want to make trouble, but I want to tell you that I went to make a visit to patients here and they say "No food' and treated terrable"". he said he knew I would fix and he would not report the matter I said "If such a thing occured I will fix it and it wont occurr again. He thanked me and I very politely thanking him, escorted him to the door. I immediately got an interne of this race and a stenographer and went to the ward. Asked how many of this race were in ward. there were twelve. I called one at a time and said to Interne "You ask men, how they are treated as the stenographer took down their remarks it developed that they had no complaint except that they wanted to leave and go home. Food was plenty and good, Representative did not talk to them had just been coming in and going right out again. after all had signed their testimony I took it to the Doctor and said "Read this". First the R --- report and then the patien ts. He said " Icant understand it". I said "Its in black and white, he is paid to come hereand must show that he is doing something, came to me, then would go to society and would report that he had fixed it up, and would look well for him with society, thought I would not talk to men" The Doctor called the man, was not in, left word for him to come in the next day. At that time the Doctor gave him a lecture and he was never allowed in the Hospital again

Immigrants were not allowed to as much as pick up a pin as would complain to their friends they were detained merely for the work the did. Bed were always clean and fresh, Many would lie under beds as didn't know what beds were for.

After war, better stock came over and they were much cleaned and nicer.
